Part A – Please ensure that you read before completing

The oversubscription criteria set out in section 7.16 of the published Admission Arrangements, will be used to prioritise the offer of school places where there are more applications received than places available. The oversubscription criteria includes a priority for:

Children who are regular (the Admissions Authority defines regular church attendance as ‘at least once per month for a minimum period of 6 months prior to application’) practising Christians, of whatever denomination, at a recognised church or religious group. (A recognised church or religious group is one that is a member of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland (see ctbi.org.uk).

If you wish your admission application to be prioritised on this basis, you must ensure that this Supplementary Information Form is completed by the vicar, priest, minister, pastor or churchwarden of the attended Church in order to confirm that the requirements of the above statement have been met.

Part B – Submitting your Supplementary Information Form

- For a child to start in Year 7 in September 2019 - your admission application form must be submitted to the ‘home’ local authority and your completed Supplementary Information Form sent by letter post directly to the school office at the same time.
- For a child to join any year group during the 2019/20 school year - your completed Supplementary Information Form must be submitted by letter post with your admission application form directly to the school office
